Modelled on a Graduate Certificate in Higher Education, this specialised pathway is tailored to meet the particular needs of the theological education sector.

Beginning with intensives in February, the program is designed to be taken over three or four semesters.

The first four units establish the foundations of teaching and assessing in higher education, while the final one allows students to demonstrate what they have learned through a negotiated extended application. Peer review, mentoring and self-reflection as well as scholarship underpin the award pedagogy and expectations of the students.

Enrolment is open to all who teach in the University of Divinity and selected research students.
