## **AMBASSADORS FOR CHRIST**

Life is one big adventure with many lessons along the way. While I have the microphone this evening I wanted to take this opportunity to share with you some lessons my adventure so far has taught me:

## Jason Derulo was wrong.

His 2010 hit single "Riding Solo" captured the opposite of our original design. We are built for relationship and community. Find people you can trust and a community of people to do life with. Eat with them. Rest with them. Play together and encourage each other. Life is not a solo effort.

### Swim in the ocean.

The cold water, the movement of the waves, the grit of the sand, floating...it stimulates your senses and lets you know you are alive. Stimulate your senses. Enjoy life.

## Don't serve to save, serve to love.

Lets simplify our lives as followers of Jesus Christ. We can plan and strategize around programs and outreach and missions and service etc... let's spend energy and focus our attention on how to worship God in and through our everyday and lets seek opportunities to serve and love those around us genuinely. It's what Jesus stated as the greatest commandment through the gospels: Love God, love people.

#### **Read and Greet.**

You will be the same person you are today 5 years from now apart from the books you read and the company you keep. Read widely and get to know people who are different to you.

#### Rest.

The ancient Jewish traditions had this sorted. The day starts in the evening with family, a hearty meal and a good rest...then we work. Work hard, but work out of a place of rest.

## Embrace pain.

Paul and James pick up on a similar theme through their writings in the New Testament: suffering produces endurance (perseverance) that leads to character...all this towards a future hope in Jesus Christ. The temptation when we find ourselves in pain or suffering is to ask Jesus to take us to the place of hope straight away and what we miss is the opportunity to build resilience.
