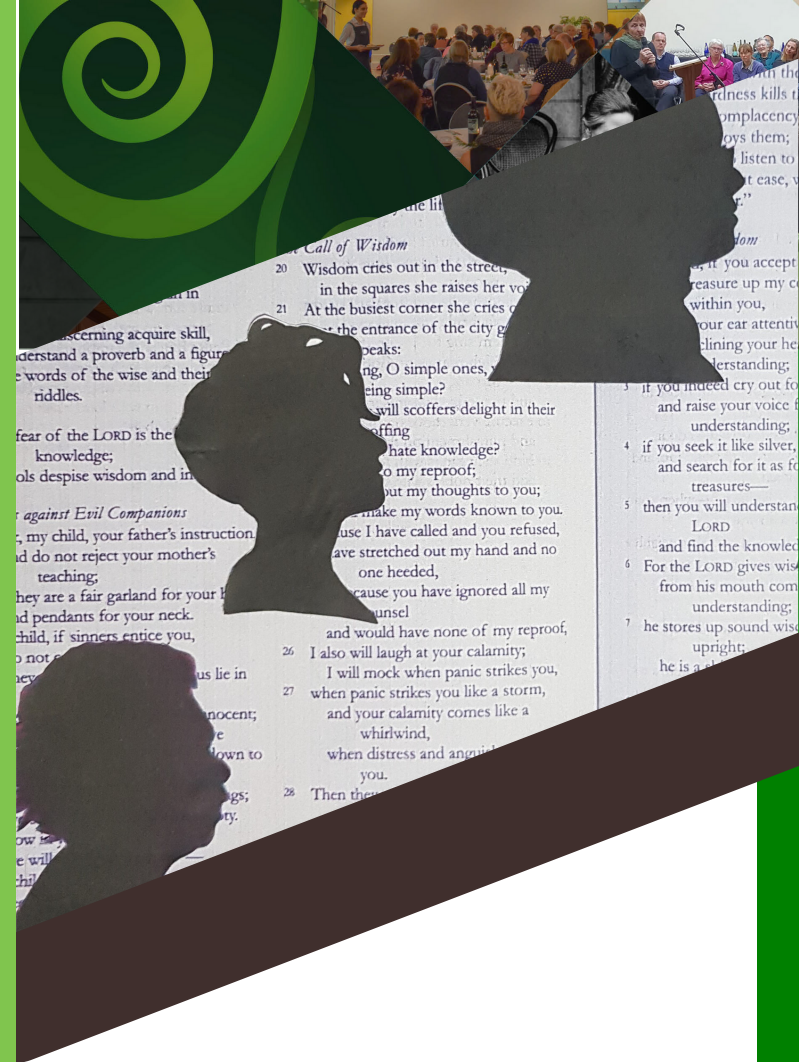

A Call for Expressions of Interest




ABOUT

This feminist mentoring scheme will support feminist research and leadership by pairing participants with a mentor to assist them in visualising and achieving their career goals. An overarching aim is to encourage reflection on what qualities and strategies enable feminist scholars and feminist scholarship. The scheme will launch in May 2020 as a pilot for a larger project in 2021.

A PILOT PROGRAM

We are looking for diverse colleagues who will help identify what is needed to support the long-term learning and success of feminist scholars and scholarship in tertiary education, industry, government or within a faith-based organisation.

The time commitment will vary. At minimum we anticipate, a one-off facilitated session of up to 3 hours to work together on clarity and focus of the outcomes mentees identify, responding to email discussions that assess and review the pilot program, and the timetable of agreed meetings with your mentor.
