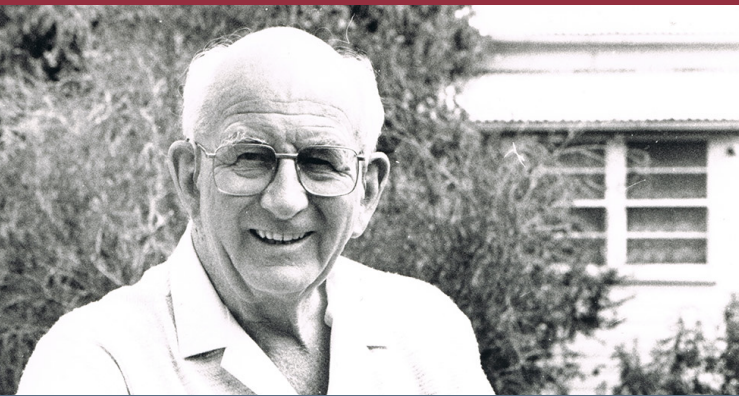


# Father John Wallis Scholarship

Supporting theological education and pastoral leadership in Australia that is consonant with the vision of the Second Vatican Council.



Father John Wallis (1910-2001) was an Australian Roman Catholic Priest who, discerning an unmet need for pastoral support in Australia's rural and isolated areas, founded the Missionary Sisters of Service in 1944. He relished the changes brought to the Church by the Second Vatican Council, which he felt opened the door to understanding the Church as the pilgrim people of God journeying together through all the joys and sorrows of life.

## About the scholarship

The Father John Wallis Scholarship, made possible by the generous support of the Missionary Sisters of Service, provides support worth up to \$20,000 annually to a postgraduate student at the University of Divinity.

The Scholarship is normally available for a fixed period of two years.

## Eligibility criteria

The candidate must be eligible for admission to a postgraduate coursework award at the University of Divinity.

The candidate must have capacity to make a contribution to the future of theological education or pastoral leadership in Australia that is consonant with the vision of the Second Vatican Council.

Consideration may be given to candidates seeking to study part-time or to undertake doctoral studies.

## How to apply

Applications close on 31 October each year, with the outcome to be advised by 30 November.
