THE CEREMONY of conferring degrees and awarding diplomas and certificates is a time-honoured ritual performed at universities throughout the world. It is the moment when awards are formally made, and is a celebration of the achievements of the graduands.

Graduation ceremonies at the University of Divinity celebrate the academic excellence of our students, honour our collegiate structure and reveal the richness of the many Christian traditions which shape our identity.

The ceremony begins with the procession of the University's academic staff, doctoral graduands, distinguished guests, and members of the University's Council, ending with the University Mace and the Chancellor.

As befits a University of Divinity, the first part of the ceremony includes prayer, song, and a reading from scripture.

The formal graduation commences in the second part of the ceremony, when the Chair of the Academic Board certifies to the Chancellor that all graduands listed in the program, whether present or absent, have completed the requirements of their awards as established by the Council and the Academic Board.

Candidates for coursework awards are then presented to the Chancellor, grouped by Colleges, followed by candidates for research masters' degrees and doctoral awards.

The guest speaker delivers an address, and, following a final song and prayer, the ceremony concludes with the academic procession, now augmented by the new graduates.

About the Speaker

The Reverend Dr Stephen Haar has served for more than 26 years as a pastor in congregations of the Lutheran Church and has made a sustained contribution to theological scholarship and education in Australia. Before commencing at Australian Lutheran College in 2007, he completed studies in education, taught in seminaries of partner churches in Indonesia and Malaysia, and was a scholar-in-residence at Luther Seminary, Minneapolis, USA.

Stephen completed doctoral studies at the University of Queensland. His thesis was published by de Gruyter (2003): *Simon Magus: The First Gnostic?*. He has held senior positions at ALC since 2008, being responsible for the oversight of Higher Education and VET programs and staff, leading ALC's successful AUQA audit process in 2011, and managing the College's transition from being a non-self-accrediting higher education provider to a College of the University of Divinity. He is currently Vice-Principal of ALC.

Stephen has contributed internationally and led local discussions on the topic of student experience and transformative learning in undergraduate theological education. His research into the provision of learner-focused levels of learning was acknowledged in MCD University of Divinity's research project, *Transforming Theology* (2012). He contributed to the development of the University's Graduate Certificate in Theological Education.

Thesis: A Critical Investigation into the use of Spiritual and Religious Interventions by Professional Counsellors

Supervisor: The Reverend Dr Alan Niven and The Reverend Dr Stephen Pietsch

This thesis explores the use of Spiritual/Religious Interventions including prayer and meditation by professional counsellors such as psychologists, social workers and registered counsellors. Using a mixed methods approach it presents two grounded theories intended to help professional counsellors ethically apply spiritual and religious interventions in their practice.

Thesis: "Other boats were with him" (Mk 4:36). The radical inclusivity of the Samoan motu o tagata reading of Mark

This thesis explores a radically inclusive understanding of the Greek ochlos ('crowd') and other characters in Mark's Gospel. The Samoan translation, motu o tagata, promotes this inclusivity which is qualified only by some opposition to Jesus. Even so, these failures are overturned by the open call for all to repent and faithfully engage the Good news.


