Guidelines:

- Include up to 5 poems as a single attachment, with a short biographical statement. Work already published or under consideration elsewhere will not be considered;
- Acceptance for publication is at the discretion of the Spiritus Poetry Editor;
- The final date for submission is 1 October, 2023
- Poetry selected will be for publication in the Spring 2024 issue of Spiritus.

BOOK REVIEWS

Guidelines:

- Reviews of books written by southern hemisphere authors are especially sought, as are books reflecting issues in, and perspectives from, the Australia/New Zealand/Pacific Islands region;
- And/or undertaken by reviewers who live in the southern hemisphere similarly;
- Reviews should be of books related to Christian spirituality, either directly or indirectly related to the conference theme, but also general books on spirituality will be welcome;
- Acceptance for publication is at the discretion of the book review sub-editor
 Spiritus Book Review Editor;
- Approximately 1200 words in length single-spaced;
- The final date for submission is 1 October, 2023;
- Reviews selected will be for publication in the Spring 2024 issue of Spiritus.

To avoid potential submission of duplicate reviews, be sure to confirm with the Book Review Editor, in advance, and as early as possible, the book title you propose to review. Reviewers are also expected to follow the Guide Sheet for book reviews, which is available upon request.
