Graduation Address
delivered by
The Reverend James Winderlich

THE CEREMONY of conferring degrees and awarding diplomas and certificates is a time-honoured ritual performed at universities throughout the world. It is the moment when awards are formally made, and is a celebration of the achievements of the graduands.

Graduation ceremonies at the University of Divinity celebrate the academic excellence of our students, honour our collegiate structure and reveal the richness of the many Christian traditions which shape our identity.

The ceremony begins with the procession of the University's academic staff, doctoral graduands, distinguished guests, and members of the University's Council, ending with the University Mace and the Chancellor.

As befits a University of Divinity, the first part of the ceremony includes prayer, song, and a reading from scripture.

The formal graduation commences in the second part of the ceremony, when the Chair of the Academic Board certifies to the Chancellor that all graduands listed in the program, whether present or absent, have completed the requirements of their awards as established by the Council and the Academic Board.

Candidates for coursework awards are then presented to the Chancellor, grouped by Colleges and Schools, followed by candidates for research masters' degrees and doctoral awards.

The guest speaker delivers an address, and, following a final song and prayer, the ceremony concludes with the academic procession, now augmented by the new graduates.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

The Reverend James Winderlich has served for more than 32 years as a pastor in congregations of the Lutheran Church, and for nine years as Principal of Australian Lutheran College.

Born in Papua New Guinea, James relocated to Australia with his family as a child. Following high school, James worked for three years as a clerk for a building firm. This was a time of vocational discernment for him. In 1985, he moved to Adelaide to commence formal preparation at Luther Seminary to become a pastor in the Lutheran Church of Australia.

Upon graduation, James was assigned to parishes in Queensland where he also served as a part-time police chaplain and helped establish the Fraser Coast Palliative Care Service. In 1996, James and his family returned to South Australia to posts in Paringa and then to Pilgrim Lutheran Church in Magill. While at Pilgrim, James began his service as Board Chair of Finke River Mission. This lasted for eight years.

In 2007, James commenced his service at St Stephen's Lutheran Church, in Adelaide. During this time he engaged in multi-cultural ministry with Nuer Sudanese and Chinese-speaking communities.

Since his appointment as Principal of Australian Lutheran College in 2014, James has been instrumental in implementing the Board's vision and leading the College through challenging times, including the COVID-19 pandemic. James concludes his appointment at the College in 2023 to return to congregational ministry.
