ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Archbishop Dr Phillip Aspinall AC is a former Archbishop of Brisbane and Primate of the Anglican Church of Australia.

Dr Aspinall is a graduate of the University of Divinity. He studied a Bachelor of Divinity with Honours at Trinity College Theological School and the United Faculty of Theology, graduating in 1988. Dr Aspinall also has a Bachelor of Science (University of Tasmania), a Graduate Diploma in Religious Education (Brisbane College of Advanced Education), a Master of Business Administration (Deakin University) and a Doctor of Philosophy (Monash University).

Prior to ordained ministry, Dr Aspinall worked as a computer programmer for the Tasmanian Education Department. He has worked in a number of roles in the Anglican Church in Tasmania including diocesan field officer for the Anglican Boys' Society; the diocesan youth and education officer; deputy warden at Christ College in the University of Tasmania. In the Diocese of Melbourne, Dr Aspinall served as Director of parish education at St Stephen's Church, Mount Waverley.

Dr Aspinall was consecrated Bishop in Adelaide in 1998 and installed as Archbishop of Brisbane / Metropolitan of the Province of Queensland in 2002. He was elected Primate of the Anglican Church of Australia in 2005 (serving in that role until 2014) and was Chair of the General Synod Ecumenical Affairs Commission 2016-2022. Dr Aspinall has been a member of the International Commission for Anglican Orthodox Theological Dialogue since 2017.

In 2021, Dr Aspinall, was appointed a Companion (AC) of the Order of Australia (General Division). The citation for the honour is: "For eminent service to the Anglican Church of Australia, to the development of ecumenical relationships and professional standards, and through commitment to social justice and welfare."
