THE SERVICE OF EVENSONG

This *Book of Common Prayer* (1662) (BCP) service has been in use for well over four centuries but its spiritual meaning can never be out of date. And although the choir leads the major part of the service, the congregation is able to share fully in the worship by joining in the hymns and responding in heart and mind, as well as voice, to all that is going on.

This service is drawn almost entirely from the Bible. Its primary purpose is to proclaim the wonderful works of God in history, and in the life and death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Its secondary purpose is to evoke from the worshipper a response of praise, penitence, prayer and obedience.

Acknowledgement of Country

We acknowledge the Turrbal and Jagera peoples, the First Peoples of the land on which we live, walk and work. We honour them and their Ancestors for their survival, continued traditions and spiritual connection to and caring of country, land, sky, water and sea. We pay respect to their Elders past and present and will continue to support their right to self-determination. We are committed to Reconciliation and respectfully recognise that sovereignty has never been ceded.

The First Lesson (Please sit)

Ezekiel 36.22-28

Here beginneth the Twenty-second Verse of the Thirty-sixth Chapter of the book, Ezekiel.

Say to the house of Israel, Thus says the Lord God: It is not for your sake, O house of Israel, that I am about to act, but for the sake of my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations to which you came. I will sanctify my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned among them; and the nations shall know that I am the Lord, says the Lord God, when through you I display my holiness before their eyes. I will take you from the nations, and gather you from all the countries, and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you, and make you follow my statutes and be careful to observe my ordinances. Then you shall live in the land that I gave to your ancestors; and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

The Second Lesson (Please sit)

1 Corinthians 12.1-13

Here beginneth the Twelfth Chapter of the First Letter to the Corinthians.

Concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

24 May – Mary, Our Lady Help of Christians (c.345 -1903*CE*) – S. John Chrysostom first used the term in the fourth century of the Common Era and culminated in a "canonical coronation" granted by Pope Leo XIII in 1903 to an image of the Virgin Mary in Turin, Italy. Mary has been called on throughout history, using this specific title, during times of war and conflict, and is Australia's patron saint in the Roman Catholic tradition.

"During times of trouble, Mother Mary comes to me..." – while Anglicans and other Christians don't venerate Mary to this degree, is there a comfort to be had in hearing her "...speaking words of wisdom"?

The Influence of Archdeacons in the Diocese of Brisbane -The Rev'd Canon Gary Harch

There have been 93 Archdeacons in the Diocese, commencing with Benjamin Glennie in 1850.

These women and men, not with a primary task as a theologian, have had a profound effect on the Theology of the Diocese. Through their pastoral & governance ministries, the support of the Archbishop and Bishops and their own leadership in many aspects of Diocesan life, they have helped shape the way we are. Canon Gary, formerly an Archdeacon for 18 years, will give his personal outline of this history, based on Archival research.

 the Cathedral. Accessibility is more than physical disability and includes language (both
 verbal and written), sensory issues hearing and sight mental health, neurodiversity.
