LIBRARY UPDATES

LIBRARY LOVERS' DAY

The initial agreement between the Carmelites and the University of Divinity to manage library services, concluded at the end of 2024. Conversations continue as to how both may continue to collaborate on mutually beneficial projects. The Carmelite Provincial Council met in early December, and considered a report prepared by the library's Interim Board, which outlined its recommendations for the future management of the library. The Provincial Council will be reflecting further on the future of the library with a view to formulating a response at their meeting in March 2025.

COMMUNITY HERITAGE GRANT

In the last newsletter we celebrated the Carmelite Library having received a Community Heritage Grant from the National Library of Australia. The grant has provided \$7,550 to support ongoing work associated with the preservation and cataloguing of the Carmelite Library's rare books collection. Specifically, the grant has enabled the purchase of materials so we can appropriately store fragile rare books in archival quality boxes, as well as safely display them. The grant has funded equipment that will allow library staff to monitor temperature and humidity conditions, and items to help maintain more stable environmental conditions in the areas where the rare books are located. A museum–quality vacuum and other items required for specialised cleaning have been purchased, as well as pest–control products to assist with the eradication of pests like silverfish. Part of any preservation project includes treatment for mould, pest damage, etc. and making repairs where possible.

The grant has also enabled the library to purchase items for a disaster recovery kit. This ensures that equipment and materials are immediately available should a disaster event such as fire or flood ever occur. It provides resources that can be used in an emergency to deal quickly with items, minimising potential for damage, and to make sure staff are kept safe while working in potentially unsafe conditions. Having a disaster management kit is regarded as best practice, and part of a library's broader disaster management plan.

Many rare books in the collection have not yet been catalogued, have only minimal catalogue records and/or have been inaccurately catalogued in the past. The ultimate goal is to create a definitive list of all rare books held by the Carmelite Library, which are all catalogued to a high standard. This will in turn enhance their discoverability via Trove and WorldCat.

The National Library of Australia provides a range of training opportunities for grant recipients, including an online Learning Hub with content created by experienced conservators, curators and technicians. In return, the library will need to provide interim and final reports in 2025 for how funds have been used to progress the goals of the project outlined in the grant application.

What the grant has not provided is the funds for the specialised staff required to undertake the rare books cataloguing and associated preservation activities. Current staff will do as much as they are able given their limited time and resources.
