THE CEREMONY of conferring degrees and awarding diplomas and certificates is a time-honoured ritual performed at universities throughout the world. It is the moment when awards are formally made, and is a celebration of the achievements of the graduands.

Graduation ceremonies at the University of Divinity celebrate the academic excellence of our students, honour our collegiate structure and reveal the richness of the many Christian traditions which shape our identity.

The ceremony begins with the procession of the University's academic staff, doctoral graduands, distinguished guests, and members of the University's Council, ending with the University Mace and the Chancellor.

As befits a University of Divinity, the first part of the ceremony includes prayer, song, and a reading from scripture.

The formal graduation commences in the second part of the ceremony, when the Chair of the Academic Board certifies to the Chancellor that all graduands listed in the program, whether present or absent, have completed the requirements of their awards as established by the Council and the Academic Board.

Candidates for coursework awards are then presented to the Chancellor, grouped by Colleges and Schools, followed by candidates for research masters' degrees and doctoral awards.

The guest speaker delivers an address, and, following a final song and prayer, the ceremony concludes with the academic procession, now augmented by the new graduates.

Reverend Canon Professor Emerita Dorothy Lee is an academic in New Testament and an Anglican priest in the Diocese of Melbourne.

Dorothy has taught extensively and worked in leadership at Trinity College Theological School, having held positions including Dean of Theological School and, most recently, Stewart Research Professor. Dorothy has a particular interest in the Gospel of John as narrative and theology, and is a passionate advocate for women in the church, having written and taught in the area of feminist theology and women's ministry in the New Testament.

Dorothy serves as an honorary priest at St Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne. She is a Fellow of the Australian Academy of the Humanities and, in 2024, was appointed as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for significant service to the Anglican Church of Australia.

In recognition of her long and distinguished service to Trinity College Theological School and the University of Divinity, and previously to the United Faculty of Theology and the Melbourne College of Divinity, the Council has appointed Dorothy as Professor Emerita of the University of Divinity.

The reformed internal corporate structure, professional standards legislation, and child safe ministry policies of the Diocese are critically examined.

Glorious Bodies: The Spirit, the Ascended Christ, and Aesthetic Formation

Abstract: This thesis constructs a theology of the aesthetic formation of the body attentive to the role of the Holy Spirit in forming beautiful saints. Taking the ascended body of Christ as the exemplar, this thesis argues that the Spirit's beautification has both present significance and an eschatological orientation.



University Medal 2025

Dr Laura Cerbus has completed a doctoral dissertation of exceptional quality which proposes a Reformed account of bodily beauty centered on the ascended body of Christ, for which she is awarded the University Medal.

The thesis, entitled *Glorious Bodies: The Spirit, the Ascended Christ, and Aesthetic Formation*, critically retrieves and interrogates the theology of Jonathan Edwards, in conversation with Bonaventure of Bagnoregio, in order to construct a theology of beauty. Dr Cerbus derives four characteristics of beauty from her reflection on the ascended body of Christ, human, hidden, wounded, and fruitful, arguing that the Spirit, beautifies saints' bodies after the ascended body of Christ, a beautification that has both present significance and an eschatological orientation. Dr Cerbus's thesis is praised for its critical acumen, its ambition, and its ability to wrestle with the complexities of asceticism, suffering, wounding and the physicality of the body. The thesis is described as evocative, stimulating and engaging.

Findings also informed the development of contextual adaptations of Spiritual Assessment Instruments including, Spiritual Distress in the Intellectual and Developmental Disability Setting: Factors Affecting Wellbeing.

Abstract: Anthropocentric definitions of worship fail to account for Jesus the worshipper. Instead, this thesis offered a definition of worship that is theocentric. Under the term *Liturgia Dei*, it suggests that worship is the eternal glorification of God that extends from, and returns to, the eternal relationship of Father, Son, and Mother Spirit. The church joins in performing worship to, through, and with Jesus Christ.

Abstract: Paul's use of faith language is explored within its wider literary context, showing that Paul's distinctive emphasis on the prepositions *dia* (through) and *ek* (from, out of) with faith underscores the relationship between Divine and human faith; between the subjective and objective; the individual and communal; belief and action. This inclusive understanding of faith is tested in a reading of Galatians 2:15-21, concluding with some implications for today.

Abstract: This thesis explores Victoria's abortion legislation as it relates to health practitioners exercising conscientious objection to induced abortion. Through a content analysis of the pertinent parliamentary debate, this research identified the dominant ethical opinions underpinning this legislation thus expounding why this law treats conscientious objection the way it does.
